# Velvet Tufted Pillow


## Materials and Supplies:

#### Items

Velvet for pillow inset Fabric for surround and welt ¼" welt cord Pillow insert Fringe Adhesive - #FA10 or FA20 Clear View Ruler - #MR50 Plastic coated Baker's Cooling Rack Marbles Fusible Stabilizer - #FB11 Iron Spray Bottle with water







### Step-by-step: To make the velvet insert

- 1. Have the cooling rack, a spray bottle of water, marbles and velvet available. (Photo 1)
- 2. Place the velvet face down on the cooling rack.
- 3. Starting on an outside edge, lightly spritz a small area with water, until the area is moist. (Photo 2)
- 4. Lightly press the moist velvet into the squares on the cooling rack, using your fingers. (Photo 3)

5. To keep the depth even, place a marble in each indentation. (Photo 4)

- 6. Complete all rows necessary for the size required. (Photo 5)
- 7. Once the velvet is dry, remove marbles. (Photo 6)
- 8. Lay a piece of Fusible Stabilizer over the area and iron in place. (Photo 7) Once the stabilizer is in place, remove from cooling rack.



- 9. Take the piece to the machine and stitch in the ditch for all rows. (Photo 8) Photo 9 shows the stitch lines on the back of the piece.
- If a larger piece is needed, go through step 7. Start a new area using the last row of the first area as a guide for placement. Continue on until the area is large enough then complete steps 8 and 9.

## Step-by-step: To make the surround

- 1. Cut four pieces of fabric. The pieces need to be as long/wide as the velvet piece plus long/wide enough to be able to be joined at a 45\* in the corners. Cut these a little longer than necessary so they can be trimmed to size later.
  - a. Example: If the band width is 4" and the velvet is 10x10, you will need to cut the length of the bands at 18" minimum.
- 2. Sew a band on each side of the velvet piece stopping the stitch line where the two pieces join. (Photo10 and Photo 11)

- 3. At each intersection, fold back one edge to make a 45\* angle. (Photo 12) Iron in the crease. Place a small amount of Fringe Adhesive under the crease line to keep the joins together. (Photo 13)
- 4. At the machine, sew on the crease line. (Photo 14)











- Trim excess band and velvet fabric away. (Photo 15 and Photo 16) 5.
- 6. Add welt cord around the banded velvet piece. (Photo 17)
- Place the front and back face to face and stitch together, leaving a small area for turning and stuffing. 7.
- Turn the pillow right side out. Stuff with a pillow insert and hand close the opening. 8.
